

Concerning Receiving Holy Communion

The Church of England invites all baptised persons who are communicant members of churches subscribing to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity to receive Holy Communion. Those who do not wish to receive Communion are invited to come forward for a blessing. The practice of intinction (dipping the bread into the wine) is not permitted as directed by our bishop. If you are uncertain about drinking from the common cup receiving the bread only is acceptable.

This week **Youth Group** will learn about 'Justified by Faith'. Next week, Youth Group will learn about 'The living water'.

If you would like the opportunity of having Sacramental Rite of Reconciliation (commonly called **Confession**), please speak with Revd Ādám Bak or email the office.

Chrism Mass (the consecration of the holy oils) will be celebrated on Holy Monday (30 March) at 11.30 at St Margaret's Anglican Episcopal Church, Budapest, Szentkirályi utca 51.). The service will be led by The Rt. Rev. Andrew Norman, Suffragan Bishop of the Diocese in Europe. All are welcome!
