Note the following important information concerning services held in the church building:

- Presently no need to register for any service.
- Sit at least one metre apart in the pews - places are marked.
- Families and households may sit together.
- Make sure to bring a mask if you want to sing.
- Continue to practice social distancing at all times: refrain from shaking hands or embracing upon entering or exiting and during the Peace.
- Coffee in the centre after the 10.00 service is still not possible; the centre will only be opened for use of the restrooms and handwashing facilities.

“Restoration Service”: On Tuesday evening instead of Evening Prayer our Bishop is inviting you to join a diocesan wide service on YouTube as countries across the diocese see restrictions being lifted gradually. A link will be posted on the diocesan website nearer the time for you to link to the service.
